

# 2023 - 2024 EAST BAY WOMEN IN ACTION MIDDLE SCHOOL APPLICATION

### **Purpose**

To provide scholarships for extracurricular summer activities for students who have participated in community service and reside in the following Bay Area counties: Alameda, Contra Costa, Marin, Napa, San Francisco, San Mateo, Santa Clara, Solano, and Sonoma.

#### **Guidelines**

- Fill out the application thoroughly.
- Include the most recent report card.
- Must include the most recent wallet size school photo 2.5 x 3.5 of the student.
- Include two letters of recommendation from your teacher, youth leader, or volunteer supervisor. Letters of recommendation must be typed on the organization's letterhead or must have contact information if the recommendation is from a personal source. Letters may not be from a family member.
- You must complete 20 community service hours by March 15, 2024. The 20 hours of required community service hours must be completed with two separate organizations. Two Community Service Forms are included in the application packet. If you complete more community service hours than required, you may be eligible to receive an additional scholarship.
- Complete your typed or neatly printed personal statement in blue or black ink. The following should be included in your statement:
  - 1. Describe why you want the scholarship and how it will impact your life.
  - 2. What are your long-range goals and how do you propose to meet these goals?
  - 3. Describe any accomplishments you have achieved.
  - 4. What have been some of your challenges and how have you faced them?
  - 5. In what school and community-based activities have you participated?
- All applicants will be considered for a scholarship but may not necessarily be awarded a scholarship.
- Applicants may request a scholarship up to \$750. If the summer activity you
  requested is unavailable or the cost is less than the requested amount, please
  contact the scholarship coordinator for approval to modify or change your
  activity.
- Scholarship money will only be paid directly to the organization of your summer activity.
- You will be notified by April 5, 2024 if you have been awarded a scholarship.
- The entire packet must be completed thoroughly to be considered for a scholarship.

### 2023 - 2024 COVID19 COMMUNITY SERVICE ACTIVITY SUGGESTIONS

Community Service Activities include volunteering in activities that enhance the community in which you live. Everyday chores in the home, school, serving in an ongoing church position (i.e.) singing in the choir or serving as an usher), or activities in a business, will be considered as community service for the 2023-2024 school year, due to COVID19. Below is a sample list of activities that will be acceptable during the 2023-2024 school year. EBWIA is adhering to the state guidelines to ensure the safety of our students and their families. Students and families are not to be in contact with persons outside of their family bubble. Activities are not limited to this list. If you have questions about your planned activity(activities), please contact a member of EBWIA. You may do one or more activity(activities) to complete your community service hours. Please limit to no more than two activities. For this school year only, parents may sign as the supervisor for the activity (activities) chosen by the students.

- Drop off food to homeless, or families in need distribution centers
- Play music outside of a nursing facility or a neighbor's home
- Send or drop off cards to a senior facility, or a neighbor's home
- Shopping for seniors, neighbor or a handicapped person
- Clean-up outside a neighbor, senior, or handicapped person's home
- Assist in an organization or church service projects (from home)
- Read stories to younger members of your family
- Grocery shop for seniors or persons who are in need of assistance.
- Put trash cans out and put them back in place for family, neighbors, etc.
- Collection of recycling materials from your home
- Yard work, mow and water the lawn and flowers
- Check to see if your local girl or boy scout troop, the Salvation Army or Their Angels has some non- contact activities in which you may participate
- Household Chores
- Check-in on grandparents to see how they are doing
- Adopt a grandparent
- Walk dog for a family member or neighbor
